Beginning Spanish Level 1

Text: Spanish is Fun, Book 1, **5th** Edition, Chapters 1-8 Chapters 1; Spanish-English Dictionary, 3-ring binder with 4 dividers.

Recommended for: People who are new to Spanish and who want to learn some basic conversation and acquire an elementary understanding of how to use the language.

Class Description: This class is for those who have never studied Spanish before. We'll learn Spanish pronunciation, practice simple conversations to introduce and describe ourselves and others and learn to ask and answer simple questions. We will study Chapter 1-8 of our textbook to accomplish the above. There will be opportunities to practice your new language skills in small groups. You'll be amazed at how much you learn in six months and how much laughter is involved in learning a language. Chapters 1-4 will be covered Oct-Dec.; Chapters 5-8 will be covered Jan-March. If you were in Rosemary's class in 2023, you may join this class in October (to review Chapters 1-4) or January (begin with Chapter 5). **Maximum Enrollment: 30**

Text: Spanish is Fun, Book 1, 5th Edition, Chapters 1 – 4

Recommended for: Those who are new to Spanish and would like to learn basic vocabulary and pronunciation.

Class Description: The class is an introduction to Spanish. The goal is to learn the Spanish alphabet, Spanish pronunciation, and basic vocabulary and grammar, with an emphasis on how to express oneself in the present tense. The class will focus on the skills of listening and speaking. If you took this class last year and were comfortable with the material, you can register for Beginning Spanish Level 1 with Brian McFarland. That class will review what was covered last year from the January Beginning 1 class in the fall and continue with Chapter 5 – 8 in the book starting in January. Maximum Enrollment: 25

The assumption is that you're comfortable with Chapters 1-8 of the book. We'll increase our ability to speak about people, places, and things in the present and ask questions about them. Text: Spanish is Fun Bk. 1: 5th Edition (Chapter 13 – 24). Also need a Spanish-English Dictionary and a 3-ring

binder with 4 dividers.

Recommended for: Members who have completed Beginning Spanish – Level 1 & 2 classes or for those who have previously studied Spanish and want to review the last part of Book 1 before going on to intermediate level study.

Class Description: This is the 3rd part of Spanish is Fun, Book 1. There will be a review of pronunciation and we'll begin with Chapter 13. The assumption is that you're comfortable with Chapters 1-12 of the book. We'll increase our ability to speak about people, places, and things in the present and ask questions on those topics. This class will also introduce topics of weather, food, clothing, directions, and will introduce you to talking about the past. Much of the classwork is done in small groups to allow a personal and comfortable class environment. Our lessons will focus on speaking, reading, writing, and listening to the Spanish language. Recommended for: Students who have completed Spanish is Fun Bk 1 Edition 5 or are familiar with using the present tense to speak and read about people, places and things.

Class Description - This class is Part I of a two-year study of the textbook, Spanish Is Fun, Book 2, Third Edition. It will appeal to those who want to improve their ability to comprehend and express themselves in basic Spanish while learning in a relaxed and fun atmosphere. The emphasis will be primarily on developing correct pronunciation, listening, understanding, and speaking while learning new tenses and grammar. Classes will be held at a slow speed in Spanish and English with opportunities to interact with the instructor and fellow students. Your instructor will introduce additional aids beyond what is offered in the textbook to help you master the language and speak correctly. Students are encouraged (but not required) to obtain a copy of Barron's 501 Spanish Verbs (any Edition) for help in the class. Maximum Enrollment: 30

Class Description: Destinos uses a video series to teach Spanish comprehension and dialogue. It is structured like a soap opera and follows the challenges of a lawyer, Raquel Rodrigues, as she travels to several Spanish-speaking countries in search of the Castillo family's past. The early episodes incorporate some English, and the Spanish dialogue is relatively slow, but that gradually changes. **Destinos 1** will cover approximately episodes 1 – 26; while **Destinos 2** will review the earlier episodes and complete the remaining of the 52 episodes.
